

SCOPE OF THE HUNGARIAN ANDROLOGY

The Hungarian Andrology (abbreviation to cite: Hun Androl), is an open access 4 monthly-issued journal, which provides a forum for the presentation of original clinical, experimental and other research studies in the field of andrology and related sciences.

SUBMISSION

The submission procedure is carried out through the Editorial Board of the Hungarian Andrology. Please be prepared to send the following documents: covering letter, Transfer of Copyright Agreement, manuscript (including title page, key words, abstract, main text, references, legends), tables and figures. Manuscripts and accompanying documents must be sent to the following e-mail address: mattvezetoseg@gmail.com.

Covering Letter

A message, introducing your submission, should be sent to the editor. Sources of financial support for the study and other matters related to the content and legal aspects of the submission should be mentioned here.

Transfer of Copyright Agreement

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MANUSCRIPT FORMATTING

Language

Submitted papers should be written in correct and simple Hungarian or English (American or British usage is accepted, but not a mixture of these). The editors reserve the right to reject an article containing numerous language errors.

Style

Manuscripts should be formatted using Times New Roman, size 12 font, with double interlines. Measurements must be given in the International System of Units (SI). The preferred format for the text is Microsoft Word rich text format (rtf).

All abbreviations, except those obvious to non-specialists, must be defined when first used (e.g. testicular sperm extraction (TESE)). Papers should avoid excessive use of abbreviations, especially of terms rarely used in the manuscript. Abbreviations used in the main text, abstract, figures and tables should be defined independently. Abbreviations used in tables and figures should be explained in the legends.

Title page

The title page should include a title, a short running title, all authors' full name and affiliations, furthermore the institute of all authors and the contact details of the corresponding author.

Title

The title should not exceed 100 characters including spaces. It should be understandable to specialists in other fields. For indexing purposes, it should be specific and reflect the content of the article.

Abstract

Abstract must reflect the content of the article. All key words must be used within the abstract. For the original report, the abstract should be informative, including actual results. For review papers, the abstract should list the major topics discussed without giving outcomes. References to tables or figures, and to the literature, are not allowed. All information given in the abstract must also appear in the main body of the article. Abbreviations should be avoided and, if used, must be explained.

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For indexing purposes, 3 – 10 key words should be supplied. We advocate using terminology found in the MeSH Browser.

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Tables and figures must supplement, not duplicate, the text. They should be numbered with Arabic numerals in the order they appear in the text. They should be sent as separate files through. Tables must be submitted in Microsoft Word rich text format. Both figures and tables should be easily understandable without reference to the main body of the article (e.g. all abbreviations used in the tables and figures should be explained in the legends). Please remember to use decimal points (not decimal commas) in English language manuscripts and provide axis labels and units wherever needed.

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Acknowledgments

In this section, mention all people who contributed substantially to the study but cannot be regarded as co-authors, and acknowledge all sources of funding. Information should be brief, and should not include thanks to anonymous referees and editors, inessential words, or effusive comments.

Conflicts of Interest

A conflict of interest exists when an author has financial or personal relationships or affiliations that could influence the author's decisions, work, or manuscript. **All authors must disclose their conflicts of interest that might possibly interfere with the submission.** Otherwise the statement "The authors declare no conflicts of interest." should be included. The corresponding author is responsible for sending this information on behalf of all authors.

References

List of references cited in the text of the paper must be prepared according to the Vancouver system. Each reference should be numbered in the order of their appearance in the text, marked with Arabic numerals in square brackets i.e. [1, 2, 3]. The names of all authors should be listed if their number

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Original Basic Research And Clinical Articles

The original paper must be accompanied by a structured abstract, containing an Introduction, Material and Methods, Results and Conclusions, which must not exceed 250 words. The body of an original paper should be divided into the following parts: Introduction, Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, References and Legends for Tables and Figures. These should not exceed 3,000 words and 40 references (excluding an abstract, tables, figures, references and acknowledgments).

Case Reports

We invite authors to present cases of exceptional clinical or scientific value. The submission should include an unstructured abstract (200 words), an illustrated case presentation with a discussion restricted to relevant clinical matters without an extended literature overview, not exceeding 1,500 words and 15 references. The main text should be divided into three sections only: Introduction, Case Report and Discussion.

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
